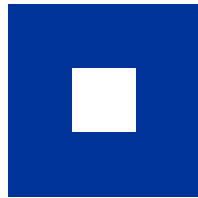

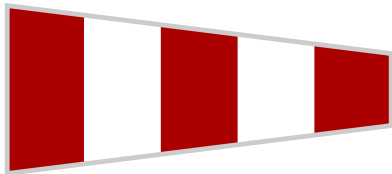

course



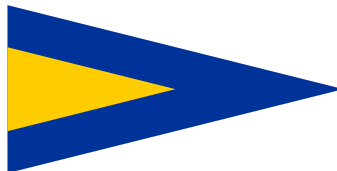

## 1 RULES

This series will be governed by the rules as defined in *The Racing Rules of Sailing* which can be downloaded from [sailing.org/documents/racing-rules](http://sailing.org/documents/racing-rules).

## 2 NOTICES TO COMPETITORS & CHANGES TO SAILING INSTRUCTIONS

Notices to competitors will be posted on the official notice board in the clubhouse porch. Any change to the sailing instructions will be posted before 1745 on the day it will take effect.

## 3 DATES & STARTING TIMES

The Monday-night series will run every week on Monday night from May 10<sup>th</sup> through Sept. 6<sup>th</sup>.

The first warning signal will be at 1845.

## 4 CLASS RULES, HANDICAPS & CLASS FLAGS

Symmetric spinnakers may not be flown — only asymmetric headsails tacked on the centreline are legal. No class certificates are required.

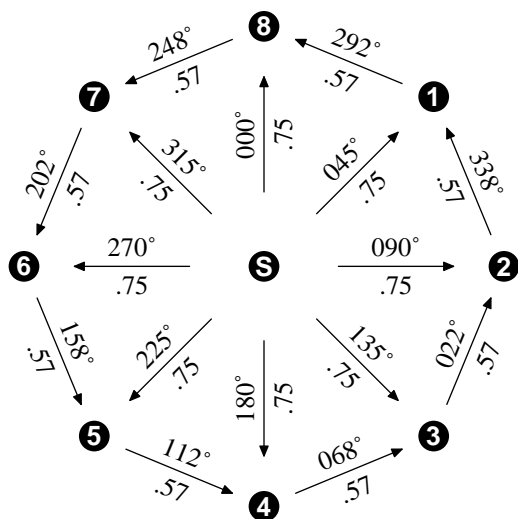
Handicaps will be seeded with a number derived from ECPHRF JOG ratings and will be recalculated after each race. Your handicap will change even if you do not come to a race.

The standard class flag will be white; however, the race committee may split the class into two starts based on length overall, in which case all boats will be ranked on corrected elapsed time.

Solid Colour Class Flag	
LOA < split	red
LOA ≥ split	white

## 5 PERMANENT MARKS

The octagon of permanent marks is centred at a point bearing  $30^\circ$  magnetic and a distance of 1.25 nautical miles from the outer extent of the pike creek channel. Even numbered marks are orange can buoys — odd numbered marks are yellow.



All bearings are magnetic  
All distances are in nautical miles

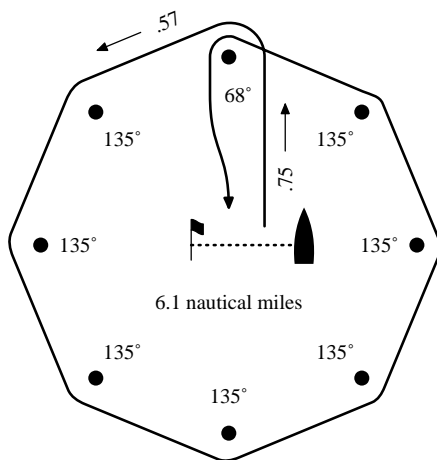

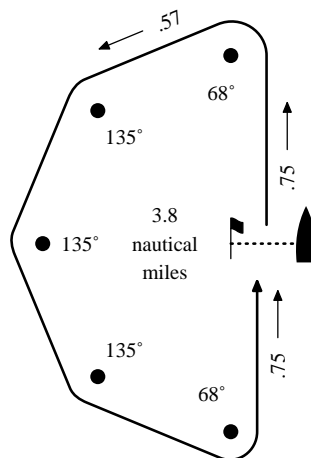
## 6 THE COURSE

The race committee boat will position itself at the centre mark and display a placard identifying which of the eight peripheral marks shall be the first mark. When accompanied by code flag "G" the *Great-Circle* course shall be sailed, otherwise the *Semicircle* course.

## 7 THE START & FINISH

The starting line will be between the blue flag on the race committee boat at the starboard end and the orange port-end pin. The finish line will be the starting line crossed in the direction from the last mark.

## 8 TIME LIMIT

There is a time limit of 2 hours from the last start.

Boats failing to finish within 1 hour after the first boat sails the course and finishes will be scored Did Not Finish without a hearing. This changes rules 35, A4 and A5.

## 9 PROTESTS

The protest time limit is 1 hour after race committee boat docks. Notices will be posted no later than 1 hour after the protest time limit to inform competitors of hearings in which they are parties or named as witnesses.

## 10 SCORING

A boat's series score will be the total of her race scores excluding her 3 worst scores.
