Racing Report, from Chris Eagen

There will be a **Summer Sunday Racing Series** again this year. Once again, it will be a laid back format with an open starting line allowing skippers to start within a certain period of time.

The summer series will consist of three Sunday races on our modified Olympic course. Competitors sail once around the prescribed course finishing back at the RC boat. Both start and finish times are recorded by the RC. Winners are determined on best corrected time. **Dates will be announced on the Website in June.** Check the "Racing" section and the "Calendar."

In addition there will be a **cruising class** for both the **Invitational Long Distance Race** on August 11th, and the **Harvest Moon Regatta** on September 22nd. The Cruising Class will start before all other classes using the same open line format used for Sunday racing. Boats competing in this class will compete with the ERPHRF rating for their boat. No penalties will be assigned for boats without a racing certificate. Awards for the two regattas will depend on participation.

Harbourmaster Report, from Jamie Halpin

It sure is good to be back in the water. Thanks to everybody who helped to get us there:

- Lynn Baker and her crew for running the kitchen (they even had a vegetarian meal for the Harbourmaster)
- Scott Turner for acting as recorder
- Andy Hellenbart, Duncan Hind, and Bob Fuller for directing the cranes
- Wayne Hind for driving the forklift and lending us his truck to move the trailered boats
- and everyone else who came out and lent a hand!

Thanks to Jim Halpin for collecting all of the Dockage Application forms and contacting all of the members who were late submitting their forms and/or cheques. Thanks also to Dave Robichaud and Stu Stratton for repairing the wiring on the small boat hoist and to Brad Roy and Jim Balfe for cutting up and removing the old wood from A-Dock.

We have sounded the harbour and entrance channel. There are serious concerns along F-Dock. The entrance channel is about five and a half feet deep if you stay in the middle. However, some members

have touched, so use caution. The placement of the marks was very good this year, but the channel is narrow.

Dredging is scheduled to begin after June 15th. This way we can dredge the entrance channel and the harbour at the same time. Water levels are up by about six inches and a large amount of sediment was washed out of the entrance channel during spring runoff. This has allowed us to decrease the scope of the dredging to free up funds for other projects around the club. The dredging plans have been designed to ensure that members will still be able to use their boats when the water levels drop in the fall.

A reminder that non-sailed boats must be off the property by June 1st, and masts must be off of the lawn by June 5th. Also non-folding cradles must be folded or off of the property by June 15th. There will be no exceptions. Please contact Pud's Place regarding storage of non-sailed boats and non-folding cradles.

That system was abolished several years ago, but WYC will accept Visa or Mastercard for the restaurant or bar, but expect to have to produce your current SPSC membership card at the same time.
