The dredging of Pike Creek and the club harbour has been suspended until later this summer. (Although there was an extension until April 1st, the weather didn't cooperate for Hotte & Co, and they were only able to complete the channel to Lake St. Clair)

This delay will affect both well allocation and possible installation of some new docks. (A joint dockage/harbour committee is coming up with a plan for new docks adjacent to the small boat hoist)

John Baker, our avid Shark racer, bird watcher and renaissance man, has resigned from the club and moved to Vancouver. John has been a full member since 2014 and prior to that spent many years at the club under his parents membership. We thank him for his 2 years as Race Chair and wish him well!

The electrical system on the docks is intended for hand tools and occasional charging of batteries. It was not intended for boats to be continuously connected to run trickle chargers or refrigeration units.

CANSail (ages 9-18)

Participants will learn to sail according to Sail Canada's CANSail standards in a fun environment. No experience is necessary to start in CANSail 1. Sailors will start with learning the basics of boat handling and safety. As they progress through the levels, more advanced topics are introduced. Sailors at the CANSail 5/6 levels will have opportunities to race at local and out-of-town regattas. All levels use our fleet of 420 sailing dinghies.

South Port Adult Sailing Program

Adult Sailing 2023

Our adult learn to sail program uses our fleet of 420 dinghies. The 420 is a responsive boat ideal for learning.

With our experienced CANSail instructors helping you along, dinghy sailing is a great way to learn to sail. Sailing on a dinghy gives you the chance to be active and hands-on with everything happening on the boat. The boat is small, easy to handle and can provide an exciting sailing experience, but that also means you will get wet and hopefully have fun learning the sport of sailing.

We are offering 2 Adult courses this summer.

Weekend Course

June 17, 18, 24, 25: 10am to 4pm each day.

Evening Course

July 3, 5, 10, 12, 17, 19, 24, 25:

Sessions are Monday and Wednesday evenings 6-9pm.

Program Fee \$525 for either course.

SPSC HARBOUR and DOCK RULES

All boats arriving by water or land to SPSC, must contact the Harbournaster or the Commodore for permission to remain at SPSC facilities. Boats should obtain permission prior to arrival or at the first practical opportunity. This includes any type of vessel, trailer, or storage equipment (ie. cradle), accommodation (tents, motorhomes etc.)

- All members should be able to moor their own boat. If improper member(s) will be instructed by Harbour Master.
- Sound and adequate mooring lines properly attached to eyes and posts are mandatory. Minimum ½ inch dock line required.
- Boats must be positioned in such a manner that no part of the vessel obstructs the dock or walkways. The docks must remain clear of hoses, mooring lines, power cords, and any overhanging pulpits and rigging.
- All applicable regulations and restrictions regarding dumping of refuse and waste must be adhered to.
- There shall be no running or horseplay on the docks at any time.
- Children under the age of 10 should be accompanied by adults at all times.
 Children MUST wear a lifejacket while on the docks, boats, or near the water's edge.
- No BBQs or fires are allowed on the docks or boats at any time.



- Unattended boats shall not be connected to shore services (electricity and water) overnight, except under special circumstances approved by the Harbour Master
- Nothing may be fastened or attached to the wood deck of any dock. This includes storage boxes or bins, carpet or matting. Board aids only approved by Harbour Master.
- Transom hung motors shall be left in the down position at all times, and shall not project into the channel.
- Keelboats shall not enter or depart the harbour complex or Pike Creek under sail.
- 12. Boat operators must exercise, at all times, the necessary caution to have their boats under full control in the confined space of the harbour and observe the rules of courtesy for smooth and unobstructed operation of the facilities.

- 13. The dinghy ramp shall be used by dry sailing boats only. Sailing school takes priority. Other uses are at the risk of the user. Use of the ramp for members only at the discretion of the Harbour Master.
- 14. Members are requested to notify the Harbour Master when leaving on an extended cruise, or if their well is to be vacant for an extended period.
- Wells temporarily vacated are to be used by the Harbour Master at his discretion
- 16. Guest yachts will be docked by the Harbour Master in available space under the terms of first night free to affiliated yacht club members. Additional nights may be charged at the discretion of the Harbour Master. The overnight charge shall be determined and reviewed by the Board of Directors.
- 17. Members must take the wells "as is".
- Members will not be permitted to dredge individual wells or install posts themselves. If a problem exists, notify the Harbour Master.
- 19. Masts stored over winter on club property MUST be taken down and have spreaders removed. These masts MUST be removed from the clubhouse area within thirty (30) days of launch day in spring. Fines will be levied for failure to comply.
- 20. Dry sail crane is only to be used by club members and crew after they successfully completed of South Port training course. There must be two (2) people in place with lifting a boat when using the crane.
- Non-sailed boats on cradles or trailers MUST be removed from club property by June 1st each year unless special permission is obtained from the Board of Directors.
- Halyards are to be tied back to prevent noise when boats are moored or on trailers.
- 23. Tenders are allowed on site three (3) days prior to departure and three (3) days after return of an extended cruise. All tenders must be kept clear of any thruways and cannot interfere with another vessels ability to navigate the channel or water between docks. Any changes will be at the discretion of the Harbour Master.
