Racing

I hope that everyone's enjoying winter so far. With the Vendee Globe, Sydney-Hobart and other races to keep us entertained, it has been pretty good so far.

As of this writing we have had the first of several scheduled Thursday evening Racing meetings at the club. It was an open discussion on our PHRF handicaps and finished up with agreement to move the club to require valid PHRF certificates. This requirement will be for all racers competing on Thursday evening JOG or Spinnaker (not Shark) classes, and all racers competing in SPSC regattas. (As Monday racing uses its own proprietary handicapping system, certificates are not required.)

SPSC will require handicap certificates from Mid West PHRF. This is the same group that is used by Windsor YC, all of the DRYA clubs, and will be adopted by Lasalle Mariners YC and Cedar Island YC as well.

We use handicaps provided by a local group called "Essex County PHRF", that was run by a group of dedicated volunteers from SPSC, Cedar Island YC and Lasalle Mariners YC. ECPHRF has not been functional for several years, and therefore our handicaps no longer really have any functional basis. This does not promote fair sailing. Having all competitors with valid certificates will correct this.


The 2025 Google Calendar, accessible from our club website has been updated with all regattas and race dates. Please have a look and let me know if you have any suggested changes?


Note that I am looking for volunteers for the following positions this year in the SPSC racing program:
