Message from Commodore Jin Frati

Last month I spoke too soon, what endless summer! The warm weather only lasted a few days and then rain and cold kept us all wondering if it was just a dream....

Time for repairs, dredging is finally in works in the Channel, the Trillium outdrive is been ordered and soon replaced, the small hoist motor and chains are in the shop for an overhaul, a rental motor gave us troubles and it's in the shop as well hopefully all will be well shortly. Many thanks to all that help resolving these issues, especially our Harbour Master, Race Director, Dave, Bev, Nick and Darcy.

On May 27 a meeting to decide what to do with the trillium next year was very insightful, several options for a different type of RC boats were presented, recreational motor boats in fibreglass, work boats in aluminum, pontoons etc. Most of the members that attended where in favour, for a similar cost, of making a substantial renovation and upgrade to our existing RC boat, making it easier to maneuver, adding a head, modifying the anchor system so it can be used from the front of the boat among others, a question about it will be added to the next survey from the LTPC to better understand what the members would prefer.

The LTP Committee taking in account the responses from the first survey, is working on the second Survey which will be sent out probably by the end of June, it will have more specific questions.

The Town of Tecumseh denied our request for financial support for Pike Creek but not for the Channel in the lake which was originally requested, a motion to clarify this is pending.

Handling of the Gooses' dropping issue is an ongoing project that we are aware of and actively working on finding a solution with the help of the Property Chairs.

The rain puddle at the end of our driveway is also an issue that needs permanent fixing, any suggestion on how to deal with it, will be greatly appreciated.



Thank you to Essex Medical Services (EMS) for providing a CPR & AED education class the evening of April 30th at the club.


